Australia's oil and gas industry delivered an estimated \$16 billion to state and federal governments last financial year, increasingly underpinning critical spending on public services and infrastructure.

The taxation receipts for this single year could fund construction of around 11 new public hospitals or 160 new schools or cover annual healthcare for about 1.6 million Australians.

The estimated 22-23 contribution tripled the \$6 billion paid in 21-22. The total includes corporate income tax, the Petroleum Resource Rent Tax (PRRT), state royalties and excise for companies operating with 30 December 2022 or 30 June 2023 financial years.
